Dear Mayor Garcetti and Members of the City Council,

We applaud your decision to declare a State of Emergency on homelessness and your accompanying pledge to invest \$100 million annually in response to this growing crisis. This is the minimum level of funding needed to dramatically decrease the number of people living and dying on our streets.

This \$100 million must constitute new resources in addition to the clearly insufficient amount that is already being spent on homelessness. We believe it should target those experiencing homelessness or at imminent risk of destitution, with a substantial portion dedicated to those at the very lowest incomes in the United States. The City's commitment is an excellent starting point and, together with the \$200 million recently committed by the County, should enable us to make significant progress.

As service providers and nonprofit housing developers, we have expertise on what is effective to address and resolve homelessness in Los Angeles. We expect a strategic partnership between our agencies and the City as this plan moves forward. In order to meet the scope of this challenge, we need to find creative new ways to tackle homelessness, but it is important that these efforts be guided by nationally recognized effective best practices. To this end, we urge you to build on existing investments like housing development programs, the Coordinated Entry System and Housing for Health program, rather than create new service delivery systems that might work at crosspurposes to current efforts.

Collectively, our organizations have 79,599 volunteers and 209,791 individual donors who contribute their time and money to our work, representing a major constituency in Los Angeles that cares deeply about this issue. We stand with you in the urgent task of preventing and ending homelessness in Los Angeles.
